Brighton and Hove
Clinical Commissioning Group

- Health and Social Care Act 2012
- SHAs and PCTs abolished
- Created NHS England – mandate from DH
- 4 Regional Teams, 27 Area Teams
- 211 CCGs, budgets under the direct control of GPs;
- Reduced and fixed running cost - £5 per head
- 19 Commissioning Support Units

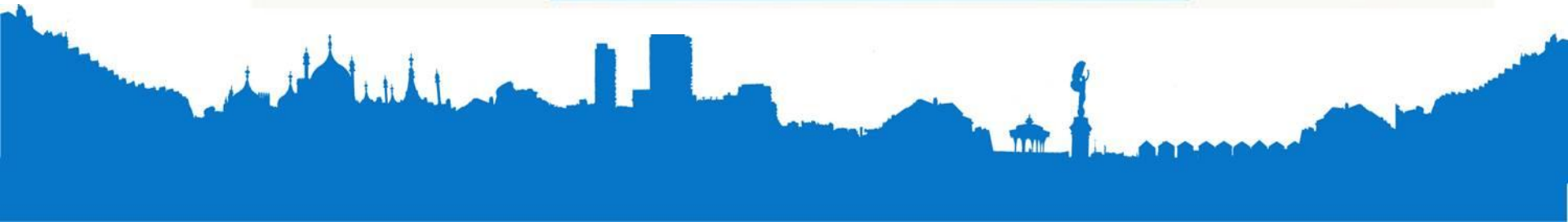
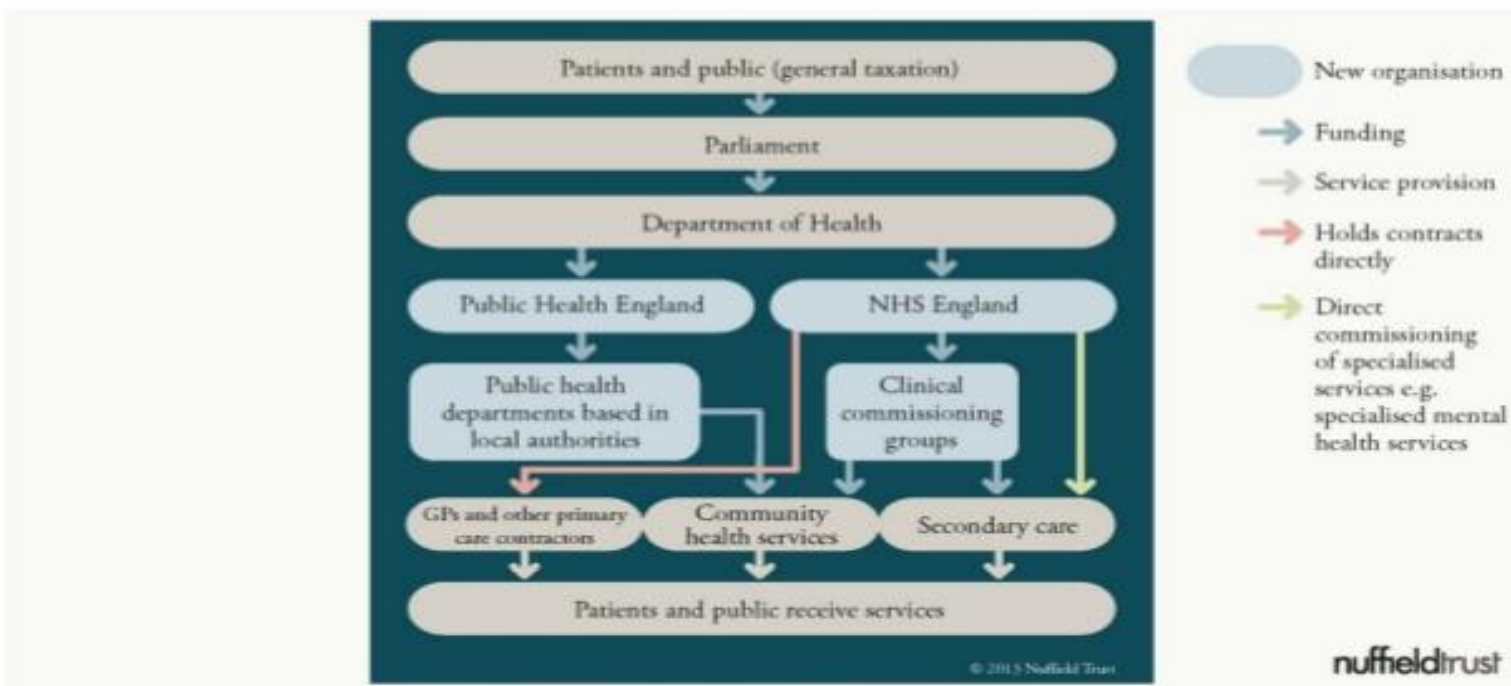

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Clinical Commissioning Group

- All GPs to be aligned to a CCG
- CCGs are membership organisations – accountable to member practices
- Clinically Lead
 - majority clinicians on Governing Bodies
 - Opportunity for connecting clinical community
 - Strong proxy for patient experience



What's Next for CCGs?

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- First year has been surprisingly ok!
- Developing strong relationships via Health and Wellbeing Boards – managing a more complex system
- Increasing focus on integration and collaborative working – “Better Care”
- Proposal to take on more direct commissioning functions
