Why do I need someone to speak up for me?



If I can't understand what's going on

If I don't know what's available or possible



If I can't speak up for myself and I can't tell others what matters to me, how do they know?



If they don't know, how will they make decisions ?

- Independent
 Non-judgemental
 Confidential
- And..Free

SOCIAL SERVICES AND WELLBEING ACT

- The Social Services and Well-being (Wales)
 Act was implemented on 6th April 2016
- It brings in new duties for Local Authorities and their Partners. It covers adults, children and carers
 - People
 - Well-being
 - Prevention
 - Collaboration





Persons exercising functions under the Act must;

• have regard to the importance of providing support to enable the individual to participate in decisions that affect him or her, to the extent that it is appropriate in the circumstances, particularly where the individual's ability to communicate is limited for any reason.

INDEPENDENT PROFESSIONAL ADVOCACY....TO BE OR NOT TO BE....?







The Act sets out the requirements for local authorities to:-

- ensure that access to advocacy services and support is available to enable individuals to engage and participate when local authorities are exercising statutory duties in relation to them and
- b) to arrange an independent professional advocate to facilitate the involvement of individuals in certain circumstances.
